Jhaneth, in Bolivia, is an orphan who supported herself as a literature evangelist and also gave Bible studies, while maintaining excellent grades. Yes, they did!

This February's recipients are doing great things. In Mozambique, Açucena is leading Women's Ministries in her local church, attending college and caring for her children. Foi, Accounting major in Papua New Guinea, also serves her church as Youth Leader, organizing retreats, youth camp, and visitation.

Your support made it possible to help 63 women this February. Awards totaled \$33,498 and went to 26 schools. Recipients are from 19 countries—from Botswana to Serbia, from the U.S to Mongolia.




### YES, WE CAN!


# THE IMPORTANCE OF EDUCATION
