

Devotional Book Guidelines

We solicit devotionals written by Seventh-day Adventist women based on a personal experience of God's involvement in the life of a woman and show how this experience demonstrates a Biblical principle which readers can apply to everyday life.

Devotionals are accepted every day throughout the calendar year. Deadline to receive submissions for the current book is August 31, although if the book is filled earlier, your submission will be held over to the following year.

Format Guidelines

Each submission will include:

- Title of devotional
- Selected Bible verse to amplify your devotional message
- Bible version for each quoted scripture reference (*this is important*)
- Your name as it will appear in print

Writing format

- Word limit is 375-425 words.
- Type in English.
- Write in Microsoft Word or Apple Pages or write in the body of an email message.
- Sorry, pseudonyms are NOT permitted; and NO poems will be accepted.
- Name your digital file with your last name and devotional title: lastname-title [e.g. Lee-Rescued].
- Include your contact information (with street mailing address) and biographical sketch.

Layout format

- Page size, US letter, 8 x 11.5 inches (*not A4*)
- Times New Roman, regular font, 12-point type
- Do not use *italics*, underline, **bold**, or ALL CAPS

The Perfectionist's format

- Alignment flush left
- One-inch margins all around
- Paragraph indention, one-half inch
- Line spacing, exactly 20 points
- Line numbering on (*don't exceed 30 lines*)
- One space after sentence punctuation
- Footnote all quote sources including E.G. White

Important to know

- The 30-line count includes a line for the date, a line for the title, lines for the Bible verse (and full name of the Bible book with Bible version) and a line of spacing after the verse, additional lines for footnotes, and poetical portions of scripture.
- If your submission runs too long—extra Bible verses at the top and prayers at the end are deleted first. You may be asked to shorten your submission.
- If you quote from other sources, please include written permission to use the quoted reference (this includes song lyrics).
- Permission is **NOT** necessary for quoting E.G. White writings, the Bible, or two lines of lyrics published in the *Seventh-day Adventist Hymnal*. All song lyrics are typeset as poetry.
- In Word documents: Find the Line Numbering feature under the pulldown menu for LAYOUT. Find the Word Count displayed on the bottom menu bar left side or under the pulldown menu for FILE/ Properties option/ Statistics tab.
- If you follow these format guidelines, your submission of 375-425 words will easily fit on one typed manuscript page (8.5 by 11 inches) using 30 lines or less. Line 31 is reserved for your name.

Biographical Sketch

Please include a biographical sketch, no longer than four or five lines, including where you live, what you do for an occupation, what you do for church or community, what you do in your spare time, something about your family and your additional personal accomplishments. You may include your ministry website address.

How do you want your name to appear in the book? Please use that name with your submission and biographical sketch.

Notify Us of Any Changes

If your name, address, telephone number, email address, or biographical sketch changes before your submission is published, please notify us promptly or by our August 20 deadline. **Contact information** includes your street address, telephone number, email address.

How to Submit

When you submit a devotional, you will receive a response, usually within two to three weeks, confirming your submission has been received.

Copyright Issues

All submissions become the property of the General Conference Women's Ministries Department. Unused manuscripts cannot be returned.

If your devotional has previously been published elsewhere, you must notify us for copyright purposes. Please include a letter from the previous publisher granting us permission to use your devotional.

If your submission is accepted for the Women's Ministries devotional book, it cannot be used in another publication without written permission from General Conference Women's Ministries.

Statements of permission from you or from us are also needed for self-published devotionals, including your own Internet blog.

About Your Contributions

We solicit contributions from women on a wide variety of spiritual topics. Each devotional should be based on a personal experience of God's involvement in the life of a woman and show how this experience demonstrates a Biblical principle which readers can apply to everyday life. Please, no sermons or doctrinal studies. This book will be marketed to Christians of all denominations; therefore, terminology should be used that can be understood by all Christians. We encourage global participation which contributes a varied cultural and ethnic flavor to each book.

Those who contribute to this project agree that all royalties of the devotional books will go to the Women's Ministries Scholarship Fund of the division in which the book is published. They further agree that they will receive no payment for any contributions submitted or accepted for publication. However, each author will receive a complimentary copy of the book from Pacific Press Publishing Association as well as an author's discount on additional books purchased for gifts.

Authors are encouraged to submit no more than two devotionals in any one year unless notified otherwise. If you have been notified that a devotional of yours was not accepted, please do not resubmit it unless you have made significant changes which more accurately reflect the devotional book guidelines.

Thank you for contributing to our women's devotional book, which has been published annually since 1992.

Submissions that are not accepted

If your submission was not accepted, it may be for the following reasons:

- It is too long or too short.
- It is a tribute to an individual.
- It is not a personal experience or insight that applies to women. Do not include a personal experience that promotes a project, book, accomplishment, or experience of someone else.
- It is not fully showing God's presence in the experience.
- It is not uplifting or encouraging; it is too depressing or sad in nature or message; it is not dealt with in a spiritually redemptive manner.
- It is similar to other submissions already accepted or on a topic addressed many times.
- It covers too many topics, none of which has enough information to be developed into a complete devotional.
- It might be offensive to someone of other religious, cultural, ethnic, or racial background.
- It degrades men.
- It is more of a sermon or doctrinal study, not a devotional in tone.
- It is too controversial in subject theme.

Annual Book Schedule

November 2019: The pre-press cycle begins with the 2021 book manuscript. The editorial cycle begins with the 2022 book manuscript.

November 1, 2019: Contributing authors begin submitting devotionals for the 2022 manuscript.

February 2020: Contributing authors of the 2021 book are officially notified by editorial assistant.

May 2020: Editor's final proofread of galley prints for the 2021 book manuscript.

June 1, 2020: Editor's deadline goal for receiving all devotionals needed to fill the 2022 manuscript.

August 2020: Book publishing is completed for the 2021 devotional book.

August 20, 2020: Deadline for contributing authors to provide address changes for receiving the complimentary 2021 devotional book. Or if you are in the midst of moving, please notify us to hold your book for the new address.

August 31, 2020: Deadline for contributing authors to submit devotionals and provide biographical sketches for the 2022 manuscript.

September 2020: The 2021 devotional book is addressed and shipped.

October 2020: The editor completes the 2022 book manuscript and sends it to the press.

November 2020: The editing cycle begins again with the new book manuscript for 2023. The pre-press cycle begins again with the 2022 book manuscript.
