Erica Aranda is a recipient of a Women's Ministries Scholarship at Columbia Union College [CUC] in Takoma Park, MD. From Oregon, she chose CUC, close to the nation's capital, hoping for a career in politics. However, she says she has now found her true calling in teaching. "To prepare, I observe American Government classes at Takoma Academy. These particularly interest me since my major is Political Studies. The students are great. I'd like to teach in an Adventist academy. Students that age face big decisions. If I help a few, I'll feel I've made a difference."



So far away

To her traditional Hispanic family, leaving home before getting married, especially going so far, was not highly accepted. "But now," says Erica, "I think they're proud of me."

The key word: "growing"

Erica, president of the CUC Latino Student Union, spoke at Hispanic Chapel of her spiritual growth. "The key word is 'growing.' As I grow with God, He has helped my transition to CUC after two years in community college. He helps me excel, giving me energy, patience, and dedication to contribute to CUC. They're giving me an education which is priceless."

Of her Women's Ministries Scholarship, Erica says, "A Christian education is expensive, but a good investment. The scholarship and recognition help me. And support from my church helps more than just financially." Erica encourages other women: "We face barriers. Yet 'Nothing is impossible with God.' As women we may face obstacles. But our Heavenly Father is with us every step of the way."

NSD Scholarships Bless Mongolia

In Mongolia the church is growing rapidly, adding many professionals younger than 30. This is the first generation of Adventists in Mongolia since Adventist missionaries had to leave during World War I. After World War II, little was heard from Mongolia until a brave new wave of missionaries from AFM ignited the flame once more in the late nineties.

The WM director in NSD and her counterpart in Mongolia, Mrs. Cleidi Kuhn, created a plan to develop translators for resources so much needed to nurture these young Christians, most of whom are women. Their plan was approved to support 12 church members to study English in Ulaanbaatar for 18 months. Mongolians have a knack for learning English quickly. By March 2008, we will have 12 translators to help produce materials.

In addition, the Korean Adventist Women's Assoc. sponsors two Mongolians per year to build up national leadership. Two young people, a woman, Ulzimma, and a man, Odd, are studying theology at Sahmyook University in Korea. Ulzimma has translated volume 1 of *Our Bible Friends*. She will continue and hopes to see all 10 volumes available to many parents and children in Mongolia.

This gift of scholarshipping people is a incredible investment. As the Holy Spirit touches the recipients, our investment is multiplied many fold. Who can see the future? But I'm certain the Lord will bless our efforts and turn them into something far beyond what we can hope or imagine. What a God!
