## 4 LANGUAGES AND A DREAM

Now living in Thailand, Graceslin and her family lived in refugee camps for years after fleeing their native Burma.

An excellent student and fluent in four languages—Thai, English, Burmese, and Karen (her native language)—she is studying English at Asia-Pacific International University. She wants to teach English to poor children to help them escape poverty. She understands the effects of poverty, having lost three siblings because her family could not afford medical care.

#### TRANSLATOR AND MUSICIAN

She hopes to translate Ellen White's books into the Karen language to make them available to poor people with no opportunity to learn English.

Graceslin uses her musical talents for church, branch Sabbath School, and prison ministry. She is married, with two children.

## GC WOMEN'S MINISTRIES SCHOLARSHIP FUND AWARDS ONE MILLIONTH DOLLAR

A Nepali student named **Sunita** became, on July 23, the recipient of the one millionth dollar from the GC Women's Ministries scholarship fund.

The one-millionth dollar was included in a \$500 scholarship granted to Sunita during the GC Women's Ministries Scholarship Committee at the world church's headquarters.

The money will assist Sunita in paying for her tuition at India's Spicer Memorial College, where she is majoring in education.

**"By helping Sunita, we are strengthening our church in Nepal,"** said Heather-Dawn Small, director of GC Women's Ministries.

**"We are strengthening the church worldwide by empowering women and supporting them in their higher education."**

Originally funded by the women's devotional book royalties, the program is now also supported by donors. The program has awarded 2,164 scholarships to Adventist women in 124 countries. Department leaders say this program has helped strengthen the Adventist Church globally, especially in developing countries.

**KA MUN**, a Health major at Hong Kong Adventist College wants to work with Doctors without Borders. A teacher says, "She is a wonderful

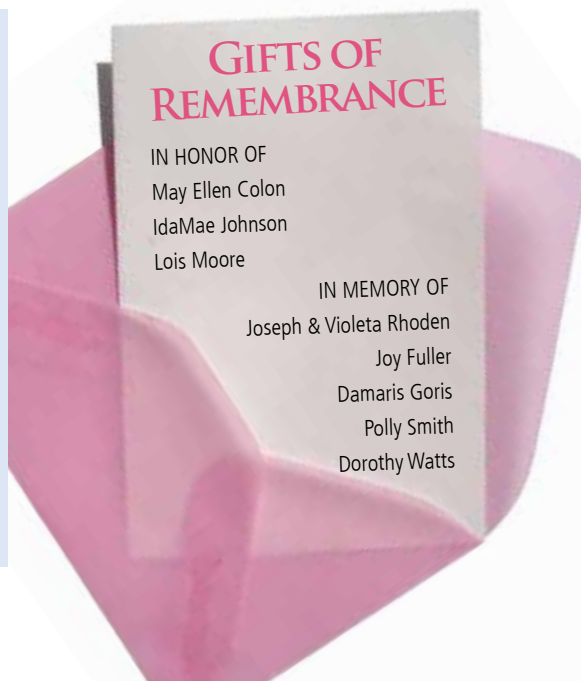
fund-raising for mission trips and participating in college recruitment. I marvel at how wonderfully she has become God's child."
